McEachern's wrestling team inspired by one of its own!

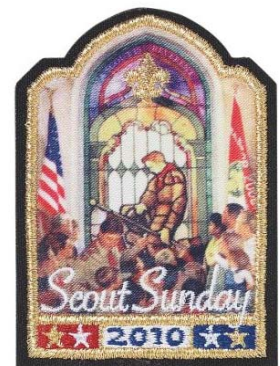
McEachern's wrestling team has been inspired by one of its own who wasn't able to be a member of this year's team. Sophomore, Weston Crusselle was diagnosed with leukemia last April. As a freshman, Crusselle pushed through the entire season, qualifying for the state tournament, while sick. "We did not know what was wrong with him last season other than something just was not right in him." McEachern coach, Jason Faklaris said. "He worked hard to overcome (everything). By the end of the season, his lymph nodes were so swollen around his lungs that he had diminished capacity to breathe." After the diagnosis, Crusselle began treatments which have continued into this wrestling season. "We use Weston as a focus to remember to say true to your passion and never give up," Fakaris said. 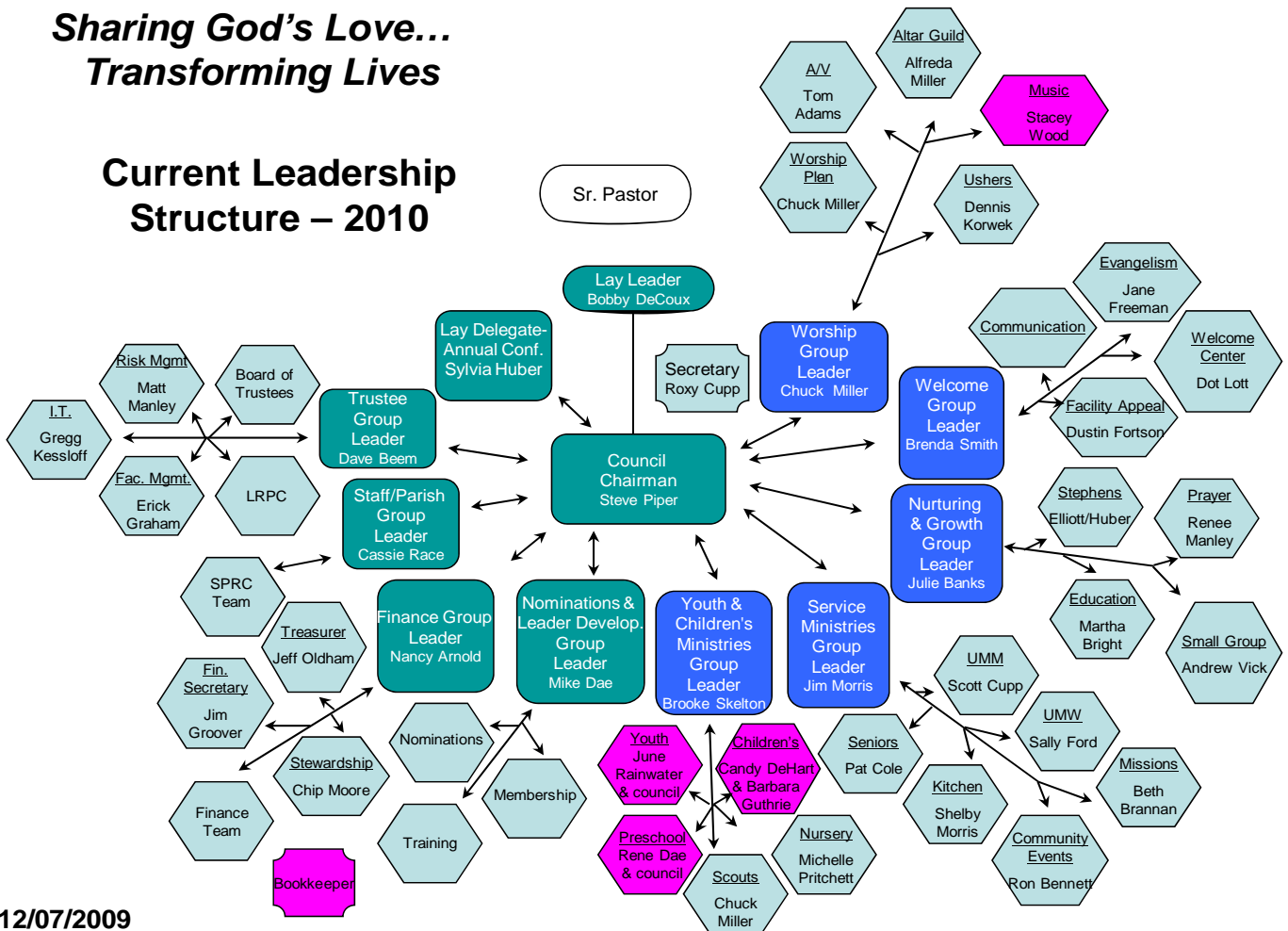

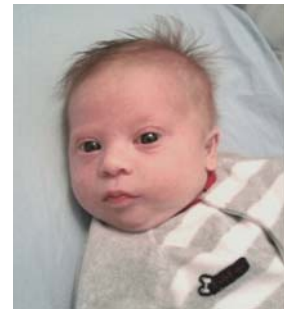

AN UNLIKELY RESURRECTION

As the Methodist denomination in this country grew in rural communities, so did the number of frame churches with cemeteries hoarding interesting stories. While researching history of the District Line community for an article I was writing (*Haralson County Tribune*, June 7, 1973), I heard this humorous story about the District Line United Methodist Church Cemetery.

Located at the division of two militia districts, this cemetery is thought to have been in existence as far back as the Civil War. When someone deeded land for a Methodist church in the late 19th century, a building was constructed nearby. At one time, the church also served as a school, and early on, the graves in the cemetery had covers made from cedar shingles.

On a sunny day after a storm the night before, the school children were running around, getting in a little play time before the bell rang. Suddenly, they were scared out of their wits; one of the cedar grave covers was moving up and down. They ran to the teacher and reported that a ghost was moving in one of the graves. Although he was skeptical, their terror stricken faces compelled him to investigate.

At first, everything appeared calm. Then, much to the horror of the onlookers, the cedar shingle cover began to move slowly up and down again. The teacher, as well as the students, was frozen with fear. What was going on here? Was it a ghost?

Then, something even worse happened. A hand slowly emerged from beneath the moving cover. At that point, the teacher knew it couldn't be a ghost. Was it possible that a corpse was actually rising from the dead? Could it be the beginning of the resurrection told about in the Bible?



As they stood there shaking, the cover moved upward and a disheveled man, fully formed, sat up and greeted them. He turned out to be a local man who was frequently inebriated. After a period of heavy drinking, he had taken shelter from the storm under the grave cover and had spent the night there sleeping it off.

It was difficult for the teacher and students to concentrate on school after that; they couldn't wait to get home and tell about the man rising from the grave. And the story of the "unlikely resurrection" in the District Line Methodist Cemetery has been retold for over a century, adding yet another link to our interesting Methodist history.

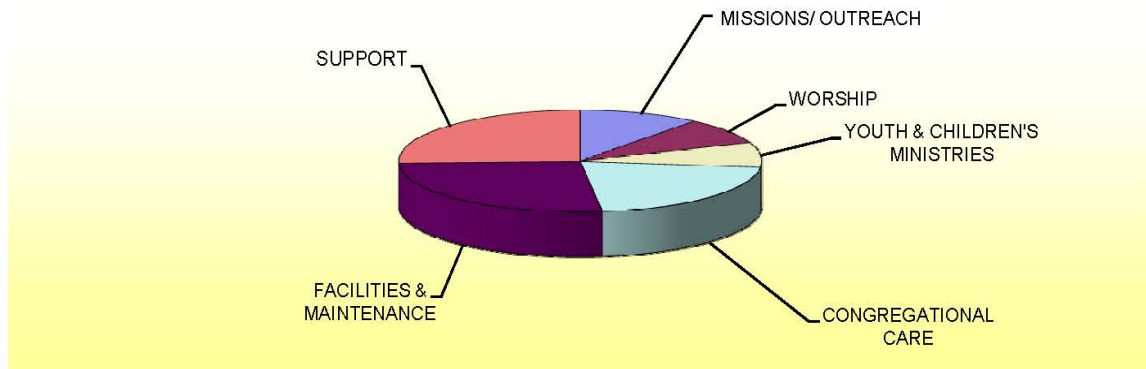

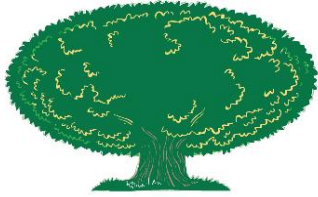
