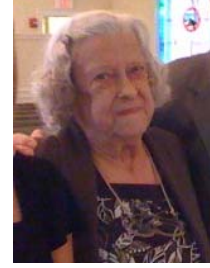

Being a Member of the United Methodist Church

In our last Love Notes, we asked you to share with us what it means to you to be a United Methodist. Here's what you told us:

- Being a United Methodist to me means that I'm not going to have to walk this path alone. John Wesley believed that the church should be a nurturing community, both nourishing its members and equipping them for service in the world.
- I like the idea of prevenient grace--God looking out for those who haven't been able to make the choice for themselves yet.
- The founders of Methodism placed great emphasis on putting faith and Christian love into action. That's why I'm a member of the United Methodist Church.
- Being a United Methodist to me means that my church and faith are based on the Word of God--that our pastors preach from God's Word and our teachers teach from God's Word!!!
- As United Methodists, we can look back on the founders as honest, decent, Godly men and take up their examples of living out the Christian life.
- John Wesley described God's grace as three phases: prevenient grace, justifying grace, and sanctifying grace. I find the idea of sanctifying grace, our growing and maturing as Christians, to be comforting. I don't have to be perfect, and won't be this side of Heaven. Instead, through God's sanctifying grace, I experience an ongoing process of becoming who it is He intended me to be.
- To me, being a Methodist is supporting my church through my witness, especially during my Back to Basics Sunday School Class. I am consistently reminded that the greater our struggles, the greater our blessings!!!

BEAM ME UP, GABRIEL!

It was the day of Pentecost, the Jewish Feast of the Harvest. A hundred and twenty followers of the Lord Jesus Christ, both men and women, including the twelve apostles, were gathered in Jerusalem to celebrate. They were waiting, as the Lord had instructed—waiting for the Holy Spirit He had promised to send. The room was filled with excitement as they talked and prayed—and waited for something they did not fully comprehend.

They discussed all that had taken place in the past fifty days, the unspeakable horror of His crucifixion and the despair of hopeless grief when their Messiah was laid in the tomb. They were completely devastated until the third day, when the women went to the tomb and found it empty. Two angels stood there, telling them that the Lord had risen. When one of the women reported to the apostles that the Lord had appeared to her, they couldn't believe it, but it was true.

In the next forty days after the Resurrection, the Lord made eight appearances. Just when they were getting used to the joy of Jesus popping up unexpected, He led them to Mount Olivet and told them He was leaving for good, but that He would come again some day. He instructed them to stay in Jerusalem and wait for the Holy Spirit, who would empower them to make disciples over all the earth.

Then it was like **“Beam Me Up, Gabriel,”** and the Lord disappeared in the clouds. They just stood there looking up with their mouths open, not even noticing two angels in glimmering robes standing there. The angels said, **“Men of Galilee, why do you stand gazing up into heaven? That same Jesus, who was taken up into heaven, will so come in like manner, as you saw Him go into heaven.”**

Now, ten days later, as they prayed in one accord, they heard sound like a “rushing, mighty wind” as the Holy Spirit swooped down on them from heaven. Tongues of fire lit on their heads, and they were baptized with the Holy Spirit.



With that one event, the cross and the flame of the Spirit became entwined like the United Methodist symbol. Lives were transformed, the Church was born, and God transferred the work of His Kingdom on earth to flawed human beings. How incredible is that!

Pentecost Sunday was May 23rd. Let us rekindle the Spirit within us for renewed power to share God's love and transform lives.

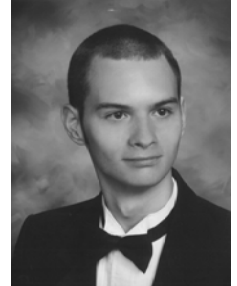

10 Commandments of Room Use

Small changes are occurring in and around the church property to modernize, beautify, and keep our property at its best. You may have already noticed that some of the classrooms have a framed copy of the Ten Commandments of Room Use. These ten items of room care are a reminder to make sure you leave the room as clean or cleaner than you found it. Soon a copy will be hanging in all of the church's classrooms.

AED

In today's modern society, medical advances save lives everyday, and we thank God for giving those in the medical profession the wisdom and knowledge to develop these techniques. But medical advances are not just found in a hospital or doctor's office. Today you find advanced medical care hanging on the wall in grocery stores, department stores, movie theaters, and restaurants in the form of an Automated External Defibrillator or AED. An AED is used to revive a heart that has gone into cardiac arrest or fibrillation. Because it is portable, it can be taken to any part of the church in an emergency. Its verbal self instructions along with its ability to measure a person's vital signs and know the correct electric shock to administer can be a life saver when a doctor or EMT is not available. The Trustees hope to have an AED installed by the end of June.

Basketball Goal

A new outdoor basketball goal is being ordered to replace the current one that has greatly served its purpose and is now on its last leg. The pole, backboard and goal will be a rust-resistant, heavy duty steel goal that is approved for outdoor, institutional use. The Trustees are planning to have this installed by the end of June.

Church Facility Use

As we continue *Sharing God's Love...Transforming Lives*, we want our church to be known throughout Powder Springs as a place of worship, but also a place where the community can gather for special occasions and meetings.

The church buildings are here for church members and community to use. This use is guided by the PSFUMC Facility Guide (a copy is kept in the church office). This manual was developed several years ago when the Trustees realized the need for written instructions that would better guide the use of the buildings. Since the development of our new Vision and Mission statements, the guide recently changed to reflect this position.

Our church facilities are open for all to use as long as that use is consistent with PSFUMC's Biblical values. When the building is used by outside groups, that in no way implies Church sponsorship or endorsement of such meetings or programs. The Trustees reserve the right to deny use to any group whose purpose is deemed to be inconsistent with the Church's mission. We intend to continue to be good stewards of our assets by limiting our liability when lending or renting our facilities. So we ask that all requests for usage of the property or any facility be accompanied by a completed Facility Usage Form.

Forms may be obtained in the Pastor's conference room or by contacting the church office. Forms should be submitted at least 30 days in advance of the event and returned to the church secretary who will provide copies to the Board of Trustees for their decision.

Use by church groups such as Sunday School classes, Youth gatherings and Preschool events take precedence if the room requested is available. The request form should be completed and submitted as described above so that the event can be placed on the church calendar. No user fees are necessary for church groups using the buildings.

Our church facilities are God's house in Powder Springs. We are called to be good stewards of God's house and use it to share God's love and transform lives.

Giving in the Summer Time

As we begin to plan our summer, I hope and trust that each of you will prayerfully consider how you will continue to support your Church. As you know, summer often is a time of lower offerings because of vacations, out of town company, and visits to the lake on weekends.

One way to be sure that your tithes and offerings continue to reach our Church in a timely manner is to put this item on your auto bill pay at your bank. If you do not have Bill Pay, perhaps this would be a good opportunity to check it out. It is easy, convenient, safe and free at most banks and credit unions. You just put in the order on whatever basis you do your tithes and offerings. Your bank will create a check and mail it to the Church on your behalf. You also have the option with Bill Pay to amend or delete at your discretion.

I pray that each of you will have a safe, happy summer and will support our Church with your prayers, presence, gifts, service and witness.

Have You Noticed the Colors?

In our Sanctuary, the colors change up front—perhaps you had noticed. Did you ever wonder why? Here's why: United Methodists, as well as many other denominations, follow a yearly church calendar. To reflect the changes of the "Church Seasons," we change the colors, with each color symbolizing that season. Once you understand each color, you can always know what season we are living in, and can order your worship in a meaningful way. They are like tools for better worship!

Season 1: Advent—preparation for the birth of Christ	Color: Purple
Season 2: Epiphany—celebration of the real presence of Christ	Color: Green
Season 3: Lent—preparation of our hearts for the sacrifice of Christ	Color: Purple
Season 4: Easter—celebration of our eternal life with Christ	Color: White
Season 5: Pentecost—revelation of God present in the Holy Spirit	Color: Red

More about the colors and their meaning:

We place these seasonal colors on the pulpit and communion table. These colored cloths, called *paraments*, are often adorned with symbols representative of each season. We use four main colors (seen above), each having symbolic meaning.

- **Purple**, the color of penitence and royalty, is the symbolic color of both Advent and Lent.
- **White** (and gold), symbolic of joy and festivity, are the colors used during the Christmas and Easter Seasons, and also on special days during the Seasons after Epiphany and after Pentecost.
- **Red**, the color of fire, symbolizes the Holy Spirit and is displayed on the Day of Pentecost and throughout the Season after Pentecost, if desired. (Red may also be displayed on days when the Holy Spirit is being emphasized, for evangelistic services, ordinations, consecrations, and also for church anniversaries or homecomings.)
- **Green** is the color of growth and is used in the Season after Epiphany. (Green may also be used in the Season after Pentecost.) Combinations of colors and colors other than the basic four are also appropriate during the Season after Pentecost.

Friends, this colorful world belongs to God, making it meaningful and fitting that we should worship with color, as well as in Spirit and in Truth. Come and experience afresh our Lord in living color this Sunday in Worship!

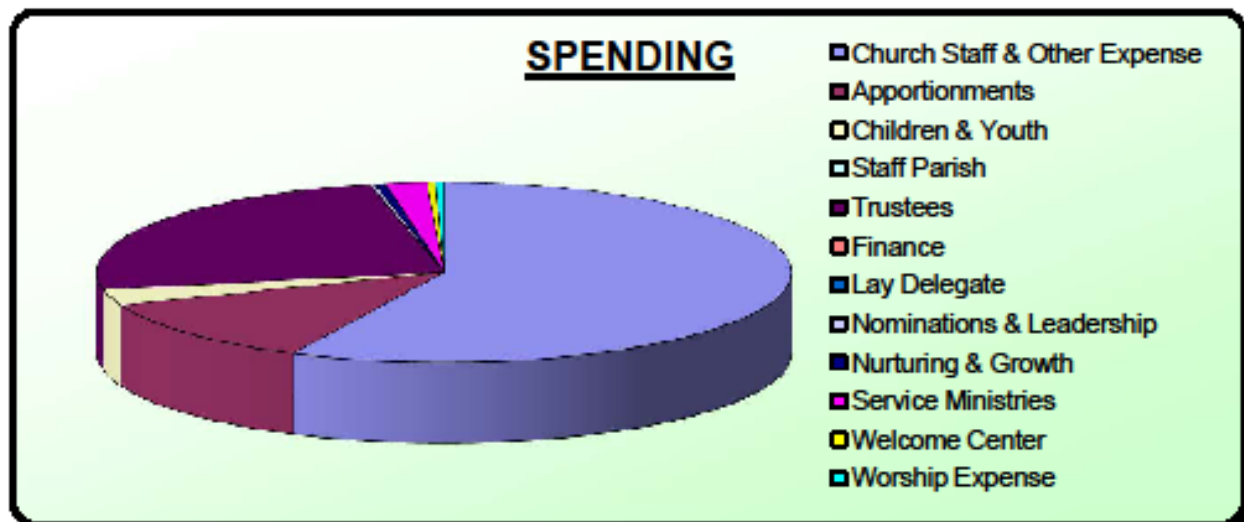
