Did you realize that we achieved some over the top results last year as a church? And I mean that in a good way! How? We had high goals in our budget, though we were in a tough economic situation in our country. While we didn't make our budget in full, we did achieve all of our ministry goals because we were dedicated to great stewardship.

Additionally, we gave more to missions than ever before. How? We gave, as we regularly do through our missions budget, to many mission projects and agencies—fulfilling all of our obligations. Our missions budget last year was \$9,307. Fulfilled! Our Apportioned dollars going to things such as higher education, new church starts, interdenominational cooperative ministries world-wide, and higher education, added up to \$42,684. Fulfilled!

Beyond that, we had "over the top" giving for other ministries through special Sunday offerings such as UM Children's Home, the Homeless ministry, Wesley Woods Homes, the Committee on Relief for Natural Disasters, and many more. That giving totaled almost \$6,000, including Café' Noel's generous fundraising for C.A.M.P. ministries.

Friends, that total is over \$58,000 for missions outside our church walls. That number does not include any youth or children's outreach ministries, nor does it include the individual mission projects of our United Methodist Men, United Methodist Women or individual Sunday Schools. Our Angel tree and Thanksgiving baskets were also over and above this number. Maybe someday we will wrap our arms around those numbers and really bowl you over! But for now, you can all stand tall because your church truly is "over the top" in giving to Missions! Praise the Lord for ALL His goodness!

FROM ROMANCE TO REPENTANCE

February is the month of love and romance – red hearts, white lace, candy and parties everywhere. Year after year, we celebrate Valentine's Day on February 14th, but do we ever think of how it began?

The story goes that it started with a priest named Valentine who was martyred in Rome on February 14th, about 269 A.D, during the reign of Claudius II. He was imprisoned for helping Christians who were being persecuted for their faith. One story says he converted forty-six members of a guard's family to Christianity. The emperor liked Valentine until he tried to convert him, then he ordered the priest to be stoned and beaten. When he survived that, Claudius had him beheaded.

It is said that Valentine prayed for the jailor's blind daughter and she was healed. This began a close friendship between them. On the night before he was executed, he wrote her a letter signed "From Your Valentine." Thus from a tragedy, the tradition of St. Valentine's Day started and is still observed till this day.

I have a little Victorian valentine sent to my Grandmother Laura about 120 years ago. Two red roses are featured prominently on the front, along with a smaller picture of a debonair gentleman with a cane, tipping his hat to a bustle-skirted lady with an umbrella. The inscription reads "May Thy Pathway ever be sweet and flowery unto Thee." Inside there is a message to "My darling Miss Laura."

From the red and white of Valentine's Day, we will jump right over to the purple of Lent. Ash Wednesday is March 9th, when the time of preparation for Holy Week and Easter begins. It is forty days long, not counting the six Sundays. Lent is a time of contemplation, introspection and repentance – a time when we face up to ourselves and evaluate how we stack up in allegiance to the Christ to whom we have committed our lives.

This year, as we celebrate Valentine's Day, perhaps we can be a bit more conscious of how it started. Then, as we go through Lent, we can repent of any failure to exhibit Christ-likeness in our everyday lives this past year and rekindle His spirit within us. As the martyred priest Valentine passed his love and faithfulness to Christ down centuries beyond his tragic death, we can also infuse love into our surroundings that just keeps on going.

As supporters of CAMP we want you to know the great things that God has done:

In January over 91,000 pounds of food were distributed to 886 families. That is more than 100 pounds per family. And did you know through, CAMP's numerous partnerships, the average cost of a pound of food is only 6 cents. **6 cents per pound!** That is why it is so important to provide cash donations to CAMP as they can purchase food cheaper than we can purchase food to give to them (plus it is a tax deduction for you). But food is not the only necessity of families in need. CAMP provided over 9000 pieces of clothing to 536 families. They also served 825 meals in the community and provided one layette to each new born baby. (For you men out there a Layette is a set of new born clothes, blankets, etc.) With this in mind CAMP is asking for the following supplies:

Baby Layettes—Calling all knitters, quilters, crocheters and shoppers of tiny baby things!!! Our baby layette program is getting short on supplies. We need new, hand-made baby blankets (3' x3') and small baby items like onesies, bottles and diaper bags.

In the Atrium, there is a cabinet where donations of food, clothing, plastic bags and egg cartons can be deposited. Please keep those donations coming.

God calls us to serve. Let us continue to improve the lives of all those in need. Providing a helping hand allows those in need to touch His hem and see His face.

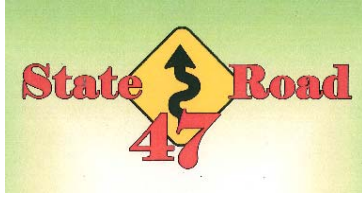

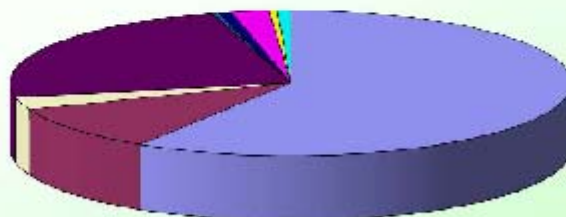
