Knight's Round Table



From the time Tom and Serena Vick chose our Powder Springs church for their place to worship, they blessed us. I sat near them in the Friendly Fellowship class and have personal mementos from when they remembered our family in times of illness or grief. Many of us had a feeling of loss when they decided to move to the Philippines, Serena's home, and were so pleased to hear they were well and happy there.

Reverend Susan recently received an e-mail from them, with pictures, in response to their last newsletter from our church. They have found two United Methodist congregations there on the island of Cebu. One is Cebu City United Methodist Church, and the other is a tiny thirty-member church in the farming community of Adlaon. Every Sunday afternoon, the Cebu City pastor rides his motorcycle up the one road to the little church on a mountain, where he preaches, holds prayer meeting, and attends to the pastoral needs of the people.

When you look at the pictures of the Adlaon church, the first thing you see is the United Methodist Church cross and flame emblem, proudly announcing the congregation's identity to the world. The patented emblem was designed in 1968 to represent our connection to God through the cross of Jesus Christ and the flame of the Holy Spirit at Pentecost. It also represents the experience our founder John Wesley had at Aldersgate, where he sensed the presence of God so that his heart grew "strangely warm." This experience transformed his life, and he set out to make the world his parish. The two tongues of fire in the flame of our emblem also represent the union of the two denominations that came together in 1968 to form the United Methodist Church.

When I saw the cross and flame emblem in the picture, I felt so connected to that little church in the Philippines. When I learned that it had once been destroyed by a landslide and rebuilt at the expense of a large Korean church, I felt connected to the Korean church. When I saw the Vicks standing there with their friends, I felt reconnected to them. It was a "Methodist moment," and I thanked God for our connectional heritage, so well served throughout the world by the cross and flame emblem.

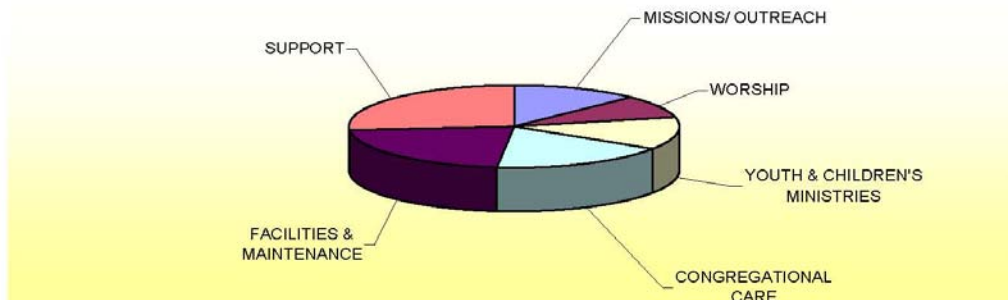
