We human beings can feel lost in the face of realities such as the speed of light versus sound, never mind that telescopes are allowing us to discover multiple galaxies "light years" away. What does that even mean? I can't take it in.

As frightening as this can be to me, these realities remind me that God is so much bigger than my abilities or imagination. I can choose to be scared by that truth, shrinking in fear from all that I don't understand, or I can choose to listen to His Word, exhorting me to live boldly, as one loved by the Maker of All.

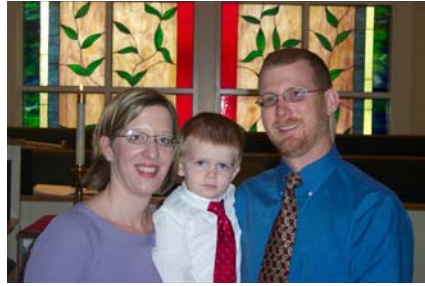

"OH, SUSANNA!"

Rev. Samuel Wesley, Rector of St. Andrews Church at Epworth, was on an extended absence attending the Convocation of the Church of England in London, when he got an angry letter about his wife from the rather inept curate he had left in charge.

He knew his pretty wife was giving extra attention to the spiritual nurture of their large brood of children at home while he was gone, and he knew she was bright, educated and independent, but usurping pastoral authority? He picked up his pen and started writing: Oh, Susanna! What have you done?

Susanna Wesley was the youngest of 25 children of a famous non-conformist minister, who had seen to it that she was well educated at home. Now she was doing the same for her children. That curate Samuel had left in charge of the church couldn't half preach. Therefore, she felt compelled to attend to the children's spiritual needs at their home in the rectory on Sunday evenings, including nine-year old John and five-year old Charles.

Soon some of the town folks dropped in. Before she knew it, 250 to 300 showed up with only about 25 going to hear the curate. She felt like God had given her the spiritual responsibility for these souls until Samuel returned. Now, here was this letter from Samuel saying she should tell them to stop coming. She wrote a response to her husband explaining how this situation in which she was acting in a pastoral role had come about, and that her conscience had not permitted her to stop. Then she placed the ball squarely in his court.

"Now, Samuel," she wrote, "If you do, after all, think fit to dissolve this assembly, do not tell me that you desire me to do it, for that will not satisfy my conscience: but send me your positive command, in such full and express terms as may absolve me from all guilt and punishment for neglecting this opportunity of doing good when you and I shall appear before the great and awful tribunal of our Lord Jesus Christ."

At the thought of being judged by the Lord, Samuel backed down. Susanna continued her Sunday evening services, and young John never forgot this occasion. His admiration for his mother influenced him so much that years later, when he organized his Methodist societies, John Wesley appointed women to serve as class leaders, and later, to exercise their calling to preach.

Trustee Say: Change is Good

Change is a word that provokes excitement in some and anxiety in others. Some of us embrace it and others fight it. Change makes us move, rethink, and look at things differently, but change never stops. Just when you were content with the ways things are, things change. But change is good. Change can make our lives easier; improve our communications; and reach out to others in ways we have not imagined before.

Things are changing at PSFUMC, from moving preschool into the new building in 2008 to our current reorganization of Church Council. These are changes that are meant to help PSFUMC fulfill our vision of *Sharing God's Love...Transforming Lives*.

The Trustees are also embracing change.

- If you haven't already noticed, the clutter in the old sanctuary (Chapel) has been removed and the rooms in the Chapel basement have been rearranged for storage of holiday decorations and music/drama props. The old organ was donated to a United Methodist Hispanic Ministry.
- We have removed the two small pews in the front row of the Sanctuary to give our members and visitors more room during communion and other activities at the front of the sanctuary. Those two pews were put into the choir loft. The old choir chairs were placed in classrooms in the Chapel building. For those of you who purchased choir chairs and pews in memory or honor of loved ones, that furniture is still with us and is not going anywhere. When you gave those gifts, you entrusted PSFUMC to honor your gifts and we still do. Even though we are making changes for the better, we are not forgetting our commitments of the past.
- Also in the Sanctuary, you may have also noticed we moved the back row pew from in front of the sound room and placed it in the vestibule. The pew from the Chapel that was in the vestibule was moved back to the Chapel.
- New room signs and numbers have been installed in the Chapel building. Each Sunday School class has its name on the room and each room is now numbered. This makes it so much easier for our visitors and new members to find their Sunday School class or meeting room.

But, we are not done. In an effort to make Reverend Susan, our choir and band sound even better, we are expanding the sound room out into the Sanctuary. This has been a wish of the music department and sound technicians for some time. This will allow the sound technicians to actually hear the sound in the Sanctuary and be able to adjust it properly. This build-out will require the removal of one more pew which will be placed in Fellowship Hall. The structure being built will match the interior of the Sanctuary and will be aesthetically pleasing without compromising the visual appearance of the Sanctuary.

And let's not forget about the outside of the church. Plans are underway to add a sprinkler system, sod and new landscaping to the Marietta Street side (front yard) of the property this fall. This will enhance our curb appeal.

Annual Conference Mission Offering Update Central Conference Pension Initiative

The Central Conference Pension Initiative (CCPI) is a long-term solution that provides retirement financial security for dedicated church leaders and surviving spouses in the Central Conferences who would otherwise have little or nothing. A special mission offering was taken at Annual Conference with gifts totaling \$300,276 in cash and checks and \$231,000 in pledges. Prior to Annual Conference, \$544,000 had been given in cash and pledges from the North Georgia Conference to CCPI. This brings the total gifts and pledges from North Georgia to \$1,075,276 including \$670 from our church.

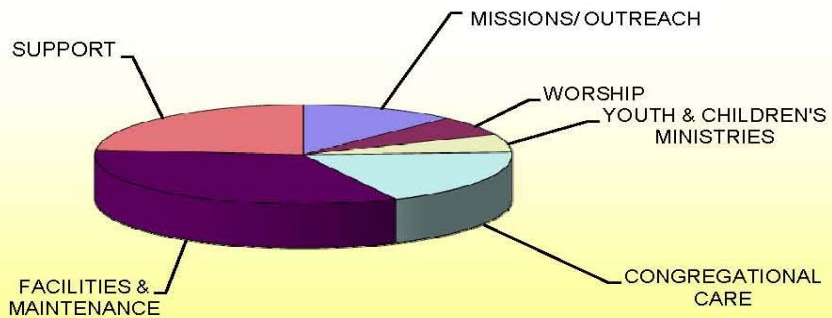
