Why Get Up for Church?

I sometimes feel led to strike up a conversation with people next to whom I sit at a coffee house or a restaurant. My children find this to be one of the worst habits imaginable. For me, it seems to happen naturally, and I do find that I learn more about non-church goers from this sort of conversation than from my ministry magazines and books.

A few weeks ago I had one such conversation with Ellen, a woman in her early thirties. She had on a pretty cross, and I took notice and mentioned it, which led to me asking her where she went to church. She said no where—it's too hard to get up on Sunday mornings because that is really her one day to sleep in. I acknowledged how hard it can be sometimes, so she added that church used to be her regular hang out until something happened, something disturbing and scandalous. I replied with understanding and she then said, "but I miss it. I do miss the way it used to be. And it seemed like church wasn't something that made me tired—it actually helped me get through the week. Now, I rely on this coffee!" We laughed.

I told her I hoped she had a good week and that I also hoped she could find her a good church again so she could have an even better week.

That is also my wish for you. I know that sleeping in calls to you after you have had to get up for at least 5 of the last 7 days. I just want to remind you that coming to corporate worship to be with God, and greeting and supporting your sisters and brothers in Christ is actually a stabilizing and energizing force in our lives. It is easy to forget this reality, leading most of us to need a reminder.

So, during this cold February and transitional March time period, let's remind each other of the power of God's love—His love, His energy, and His real presence in our worship. There is nothing more critical for us, His children, than to spend time with Him and with His very Body, the church.

Greetings from Niger! After completing two months of language and culture training, Carrie took her oath as an official Peace Corps Volunteer on December 12, 2008. During her training, she lived with a host family that only spoke a language called Zarma. Friendships were formed and tears were barely held back as she left this village following graduation. Carrie's permanent village (where she will be living for the next 2 years) has a population of approximately 1000 people. This village, located on the Niger River in the Tillabery region, has no electricity or running water. Carrie is still working on her language skills and making new friends in her village. Teaching environmental education and working with trees like Morengia and gum Arabic will be Carrie's primary job. Please continue to pray for Carrie. Her only source of news from the rest of the world is via her short wave radio, so she would love to receive letters and news from home. I do miss everyone so please send letters to Carrie Miller, PCV, Corps de la Paix, Gotheye, Niger, West Africa—marked Air Mail or Par Avion.

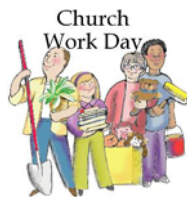

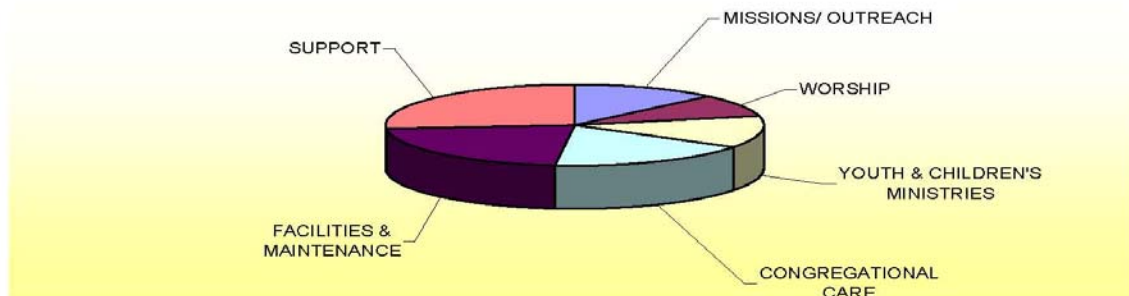
